

Society of St. Vincent de Paul St Michael Conference 2024 Report to St Michael Catholic Community

The Society of St Vincent de Paul, St Michael Conference, was established 31 years ago, in January 1994.

The Mission of the Society of St Vincent de Paul (SSVP) is to live the Gospel message by serving disadvantaged individuals within our parish boundaries with respect, justice, and joy ... regardless of creed, ethnicity, or point of view. Members meet regularly to pray, deepen their understanding of the Society, share ideas, discuss challenges encountered in serving the poor, and develop fellowship. Our funding is entirely derived from the parishioners of St Michael Catholic Community who donate with great generosity, kindness, and thoughtfulness, for which we are eternally grateful.

Volunteers

We currently have **56** active members serving in various capacities (e.g., home visitors, food purchasers and larder committee, phone coordinator, banking director, or special advisor). Our executive team is comprised of the President, a banker, a treasurer, and a secretary. In the past year, our dedicated team of volunteers has contributed over **2032** hours to serving the needs of the less fortunate in our community. Two of our current members, *Paulette Crawford* and *Paula Smith* were *founding* members of the St Michael SSVP conference 31 years ago. They enthusiastically continue to donate their time and talent in serving the poor and providing guidance, support, and mentorship to those of us who gratefully benefit from their experience and expertise.

We are also blessed to have *Father Kelvin Chukwurah* as our Spiritual Advisor, who fosters the spiritual development of our members.

Challenges in 2024

Financially, we are struggling with high food costs and high need within the community. In mid-2024 we had to put a freeze on rent and utility assistance, after providing considerably more aid in 2024 for rent/utility assistance than any other parish or Conference in our Western Calgary peer group including St. Peter's, St. Bernard's, Holy Name and Sacred Heart.

Our operation focused on food assistance in the local community, supporting the refugee family as per our commitments, and providing assistance to St. Bernard's SSVP who were heading for bankruptcy while surrounded by critical need in the Bowness area.

Donations

Our operation would not be possible without the generous donations of our community. We greatly rely on the parishioners of St. Michael's Catholic Community for their ongoing support of our effort. In 2024 we received over **\$162,000!** Thank you for your generosity! Please be aware that going into 2025, one in ten Calgarians are either living low income or below the poverty line. Calgary is the second most unequal city in Canada for income distribution. The SSVP work continues and relies on your support! Options on how to donate are provided at the end of this report.

Food Distribution and Home Visits

In the past year, volunteers visited **124** homes, providing support to **479** adults and **418** children, preparing and delivering **258** food hampers. Members always conduct visits in pairs, reaching out to individuals where they live: listening, encouraging, and hopefully being a friend. We also provide regular food support for a Refugee family.

"I have been out of the workforce a decade now. I've long left behind a somewhat comfortable lifestyle shared with loved ones filled with sporting events, concerts, and occasional nights out or weekend trips. I've lost loved ones

through disease and tragedy, facing my own demise presently and accordingly lost my faith along the way. Your efforts, assistance and support through my journey are very much recognized and appreciated and somewhat reinvigorate that diminishing faith." — Vincentian friend

Larder and Food Costs

We have a dedicated team, led by Lora Saccomani, to ensure our food larder is well stocked and ready for food hamper preparation. Over recent years our food budget has doubled, due to high demand and an increase in food prices. In 2024 we've spent and distributed over \$34,000 in food. We are projecting a \$40,000 larder budget in 2025 to respond to the challenging economic climate.

Financial assistance

Although our core service is to provide food hampers, we also assist with rent, utilities, and other urgent needs as feasible. Over **\$32,000** was provided for rent and utility assistance in 2024. Due to the high demand in assistance requests versus financial constraints and operational commitments, we made a decision to pause rent/utility assistance mid-2024 to be resumed in 2025. We also refer individuals or families to other community agencies better equipped to meet ongoing needs when the situation is beyond our ability to manage.

Twinning

"Twinning" is one aspect of Vincentian work where we reach out and share our resources and deepen our Vincentian spirit of friendship with our Brothers and Sisters in the solidarity of universally helping the poor. Our conference started a twinning partnership with SSVP Reina De La Paz Conference, Guatemala in 2015.

The SSVP Reina De La Paz conference needed support for their coffee and bee projects to serve their community. Through our fraternal twinning with Reina De La Paz conference, we at St Michaels conference want to serve God's will and share our mutual resources through solidarity.

"We are very grateful for the financial support that SSVP St Michaels Conference provides to Reina de La Paz, otherwise, it would be impossible for this conference to help so many poor families in our communities with food and medicines. St. Bernards SSVP Conference Assistance

SSVP St. Bernard Conference supports the communities of Bowness, Greenwood, Montgomery, St. Andrews Heights, Parkdale, and Green Briar. In recent years SSVP St. Bernard's conference faced a growing demand for food hampers with dwindling donations. The conference provides 40-60 hampers per month. In May of 2024 the conference made an appeal to St Michael's conference and St Peter's Conference requesting a monthly support to keep them for closing their doors in October of 2024.

St. Michael's conference has pledged their financial support of \$1500/month to help St. Bernard to continue the work of helping and meeting the basic need of food in their community. St Michael's Conference also extends support to St Bernard's Conference by including 30 families in need, each year in the Christmas Hamper program.

"I would like to mention again that having this extra help has made a world of difference in our ability to plan and provide for our clients. We no longer need to be thinking week to week if we can survive." -SSVP St Bernard Conference

Christmas Hamper Program

The *Christmas Hamper* program, made possible through numerous volunteer hours devoted by members of the Christmas Hamper Committee, is largely funded through the St Vincent de Paul Society. This year, over **409** parish volunteers prepared and delivered **169** hampers, serving **664** individuals, of whom **360** were children. Hampers consisted of nonperishable foods, gift cards and gifts for children.

The total value of the Christmas Hamper program this year was \$71,537 which comprised of cash directly expended, as well as donated gifts.

Parish schools supported the program with food drives and student volunteers. Special thank you to Colleen Fitzpatrick and her Christmas Hamper team, and the SSVP members especially, Barb Mulcahy, Lora Saccomani, Lana McFadden and Deana Helton our School's Liaison, the volunteers and the support of parish administration and staff in the success of this year's program.
